## EASTERN DIVISION PLAYER/PITCHER OF THE WEEK

Week ending June 22, 2008

**Player of the Week: Mark Onorati (Manhattan), Amsterdam**

Mark Onorati batted .500 (8-for-16) and drove in a league-high 11 runs in four games for the Mohawks. He smashed two home runs, scored five runs, stole two bases, collected 15 total bases and recorded a .939 slugging percentage. Onorati had three multi-hit and four multi-RBI games. He tallied at least one hit in all four games and homered in back-to-back contests against Glens Falls and Bennington. Onorati currently leads the league with 16 runs scored and 15 RBI.

**Pitcher of the Week: Marc Damon (Pima CC), Glens Falls**

Marc Damon is the second Glens Falls' pitcher in a row to be named Eastern Division Pitcher of the Week. Damon was 1-0 with four saves and a 0.00 ERA in five appearances last week for the Golden Eagles. He allowed no hits, walked five and struck out 11 in eight innings pitched. Damon converted four saves in four appearances. Sunday night, he pitched a season-high three innings of relief and struck out four to earn a win over Bennington.

## WESTERN DIVISION PLAYER/PITCHER OF THE WEEK

**Player of the Week: Kevin McGrath (West Chester), Geneva**

Kevin McGrath batted .500 (7-for-14) as the Red Wings went undefeated in four games. McGrath recorded a team-high five RBI and seven runs scored to go along with a double, a triple, a home run, four stolen bases and a .929 slugging percentage. He posted three multi-hit, three multi-run and two multi-RBI games. McGrath's best performance of the week was a 3-for-4 outing against Bolivar with a two-run home run and two runs scored.

**Pitcher of the Week: Joe Scarlata (Columbia), Allegany County**

For the second week in a row, an Allegany County Nitros pitcher has been named Western Division Pitcher of the Week. Joe Scarlata pitched a complete-game four-hitter as the Nitros defeated the first-place Dodgers, 3-1, at Maple City Park on June 19. Scarlata allowed one run, walked one and struck out six in the nine-inning contest. He retired 26 of 31 batters faced and he sat down 18 of the first 20 Hornell hitters. Scarlata allowed just two runners past first base. He is currently 1-1 with a 2.25 earned run average in three appearances.

## WEEKLY TEAM NOTES

**Allegany County (3-1 week, 8-5 overall):** In spite of the rotten weather in western New York, the Nitros went 3-1 to pull into a three-way tie for second place with Geneva and Brockport. Due to bad weather and a power outage in Geneva on Wednesday night, the Nitros did not finish an official game until a 3-1 victory over Hornell on Thursday night. Joe Scarlata (Columbia) shut down a Hornell offense that was had scored seven or more runs in six-straight games....Allegany County twice defeated Niagara to make up for a 20-9 defeat to the Power on opening night...Sunday, the Nitros showed flashes of the James Barksdale ('04-'05) era with five stolen bases against the Power...Matt Weber (Canisius) and Anthony Cimabue (Wilmington) were added to the roster. Weber, a 6-3 lefty out of Troy, N.Y., pitched for Amsterdam last summer...**Crunching Numbers:** Alex Raetzloff (Webster) has an eight-game hitting streak.....**Who's Hot:** Rob Fondu (Furman) batted .357 with five hits, two runs scored, two RBI and three stolen bases. Josh Wierzba (Toledo) drove in a team-high five runs. Mike Londino (Delaware) struck out seven in two scoreless appearances.

**Amsterdam (2-2 week, 9-4 overall):** The Mohawks started the week with last-minute losses to Little Falls and Glens Falls before winning back-to-back games against Watertown and Bennington...In two losses, Amsterdam pitchers allowed 18 runs; in two wins, opponents scored just two runs...The Mohawks totaled 32 runs in four games...Dan Forman (Manhattan) allowed his first earned run of the season on Friday night, ending a string of 15 scoreless frames...Shuttleworth Park hosted 1,963 fans on Friday night, Amsterdam's second-largest crowd of the season...The earliest start time for a NYCBL game this season was recorded on Monday when Amsterdam and Little Falls started at 10:30 a.m....The Miners and Mohawks have combined for 26 runs in two meetings...**Crunching The Numbers:** The Mohawks have not been shut out in 13 games this season. **Who's Hot:** Chris Bisson (Kentucky) batted .500 with a team-high nine hits and seven runs scored. He enjoyed three multi-hit and three multi-RBI games. Ricky Pacione (Marist) plated six runs and hit .364.

**Bennington (3-2 week, 7-7 overall):** Bennington was the only team in the division aside from Glens Falls to win more than two games last week...The Bombers swept a doubleheader at Little Falls on Saturday night. It marked the first time in franchise history that the team won both ends of a road doubleheader...Andrew Quinn (Assumption) and Jim Niesuchouski (Lamar) combined on Bennington's third shutout of the season in a 3-0 win over Little Falls...Second-year Bomber Tristan Hobbes (ECSU) debuted as a special contributor to the *Bennington Banner* newspaper with his column "Inside The Cockpit"...With seven wins, the Bombers are more than halfway to surpassing last year's total of 12...**Crunching The Numbers:** Sunday night's 14-inning game between Bennington and Glens Falls is the longest game in team history...**Who's Hot:** Joey Bergman (Charleston) led the Bombers in hits (7), home runs (1), total bases (12) and slugging percentage (.706). He is tops on the team overall with a .347 batting average. Steve Cadoret (Boston College) did not allow a run in three relief appearances.

**Bolivar (2-3 week, 3-10 overall):** After a rough start, the Athletics earned two wins in five games this past week. The team put together back-to-back wins against Niagara for the second time in the last two years. Bolivar swept a home-and-home with Niagara last July...The Athletics scored 31 runs in five games and plated five or more runs in four of those contests...Bolivar used a league-high 13 pitchers last week...Stephen Jenkins (Mercer) and Kevin Cope (UAB) turned in the top performances. Jenkins scattered seven hits over six innings and struck out five at Niagara on Wednesday. Cope had three hits and two RBI in the same game with the Power...Cope saw an eight-game hit streak end on Saturday with an 0-for-3 effort against Elmira...**Crunching the Numbers:** Bolivar is averaging nearly five runs per game (4.85) but allowing almost 10 (9.69)...**Who's Hot:** Jay Cox (Florence-Darlington) slammed five hits in five games, scored five runs, tied for a team high with four walks and batted .417. Kevin Cope (UAB) put together a team-high six hits and four runs batted in.

## WEEKLY TEAM NOTES

**Brockport (3-3 week, 8-5 overall):** An eight-game winning streak came to an end as the 'Bats dropped three-straight to end the week, including a doubleheader for first place against Hornell...Brockport's streak is the longest of any league team this season...The Orange and Black started the week with 31-runs combined in three wins over Elmira (two) and Bolivar...Elmira and Brockport twice went to extra innings and twice Brockport won, the second victory came on a walk-off wild pitch on June 20...While Brockport officially played six games, the Bats had to finish a seventh against Bolivar from a halted game on June 13. Between June 17 and June 20, the Bats played 34 innings...**Crunching the Numbers:** Brockport outscored opponents, 57-40, during its eight-game winning streak...**Who's Hot:** David Ahonen (Ithaca) and Corey Taylor (Binghamton) combined for 20 hits, 10 runs scored, 10 runs batted in and 23 total bases. Taylor was among the league leaders with 11 hits and six runs scored.

**Elmira (2-2 week, 5-6 overall)** The western New York weather did not benefit the Pios as they played just four games last week with two wins and two extra-inning losses...Elmira's offense plated 34 runs, twice scored in double-digits and never had fewer than four runs...Four of Elmira's 11 games this season have gone to extra innings...The Pioneers' .282 overall team batting average is second in the NYCBL...Mike Mergenthaler (Richmond), an all-rookie team selection from the Atlantic-10, made his Elmira debut on Saturday night and went 3-for-5 with two RBI and two runs scored...Rye Davis (WKU) smashed Elmira's first home run of the season at Brockport on June 20...Saturday night, Shane Wolf (Elmira '06-'07) became the first former Pioneer to play in the minor leagues, he was part of the first no-hitter in Tri-City ValleyCats history...**Crunching the Numbers:** Elmira hit just two home runs as a team last year and has one this year, Justin Wright (VCU) belted five in the Pioneers' inaugural season (2006)...**Who's Hot:** Nick Messenger (Siena) had five hits, six runs scored, three RBI, four walks and four stolen bases in four games. Chris Spatkowski (Pace) ripped eight hits and batted .400. Bryce Jenney (WKU) struck out 11 in just six innings pitched against Bolivar on Saturday.

**Geneva (4-0 week, 7-4 overall):** The Red Wings were hot, spicy and number one in the Western Division this past week with an undefeated, 4-0, record...Geneva had games halted on Tuesday and Wednesday. Tuesday's game against Allegany County was stopped because of a power failure and Wednesday evening's game versus Webster was halted because of bad weather...Geneva scored 39 runs in four games and their lowest output was nine, twice...Ryan Uphouse (George Mason) led the Wings with eight hits, seven of which were doubles. His seven doubles lead the league...Dan Rouah (Lynn) struck out 11 batters in seven innings Saturday night against Allegany County...Mike Assmann (Cortland State) turned in the longest performance of the season for the Wings with eight and a third innings pitched against Webster on June 19...**Crunching the Numbers:** In seven wins this season, the Red Wings have scored 53 runs, opponents have just 20...**Who's Hot:** Doug Elliot (UConn) and Matt Perry (Holy Cross) tied Player of the Week Kevin McGrath (West Chester) with seven hits. Perry drove in five runs and scored four. John Sills (Holy Cross) is tied for a league high with a 10-game hitting streak.

**Glens Falls (6-0 week, 10-3 overall)** Over the last two regular seasons, the Golden Eagles have won 44 games and lost just nine...Glens Falls went undefeated in six games last week and has won seven in a row overall... Shane Davis allowed his first earned run of the season against Watertown on June 16, snapping a string of 16 scoreless innings...Todd Brazeal (South Florida) had at least one hit in all six of Glens Falls' games last week, he currently has an eight-game hitting streak...Four of the Golden Eagles' six games were within the friendly confines of East Field, they are 6-1 at home this season...Glens Falls ended the week with two walk-off wins in its last three games. Todd Brazeal (South Florida) drew a bases-loaded walk in the 10th on Thursday night to defeat Watertown. Sunday, Jose Valerio (San Diego) scored on a Curt Courtwright sacrifice fly in the 14th to edge Bennington...Glens Falls defeated New York's Finest, 6-0, on Friday night in an exhibition game...**Crunching the Numbers:** Glens Falls is 4-1 in one-run games this season...**Who's Hot:** Stefan Romero (Pima CC) had a .560 on-base percentage last week. He had five hits, walked six times and was hit by a pitch three times. Nick McCoy (San Diego) started all six games and drove in seven runs. Jamie Storey (Midland) yielded one run in four relief appearances.

## WEEKLY TEAM NOTES

**Hornell (4-2 week, 10-3 overall):** The Dodgers began the week and finished the week leading the Western Division...Back-to-back "doubleheader" sweeps of Brockport and Webster propelled the Blue and White to a 4-2 record. Hornell played a resumed game and a regular nine-inning game against Webster on Friday evening at R.I.T. Saturday, the Dodgers hosted a twin bill, two nine-inning games, against Brockport...After playing last Sunday night, the Dodgers did not play again until Thursday at home against Allegany County...Adam Eggemeyer (SIU Edwardsville) has recorded hits in 12 of his first 13 games, he currently has a 10-game hitting streak...Sean Toler (Missouri State), Dan Tunison (LeMoyne) and Adam Schrader (SW Minnesota State) all made starts of six innings or more last week and struck out at least six...**Crunching The Numbers:** Hornell leads the league in team batting average (.285) and team ERA (2.35)...**Who's Hot:** Jose Sanchez (Delaware State) batted .423 and was among the league leaders with 11 hits. Zach Kinkeade (St. Charles CC) registered nine hits in six games

**Little Falls (2-3 week, 6-7 overall):** The week started on a positive note with a come-from-behind victory over red-hot Amsterdam but ended with a home sweep at the hands of Bennington...The Miners scored 18 runs in two wins and five in three losses...Little Falls earned its' first win at East Side Recreation Park in Saratoga Springs, N.Y., since 2006 with an 8-7 decision over the Phillies on Friday night. The Miners hadn't won in the Spa City since July 9, 2006, when they were the Little Falls Diamond Miners...Both of the Miners wins last week were of the comeback variety. Joaquin Valdes (Palm Beach Atlantic) smashed a three-run home run in the eighth inning on Monday to erase an 8-6 deficit to Amsterdam. Friday night, the Miners rallied for two runs in the top of the ninth at Saratoga. Newcomer Dave Wendt (Dowling) drove in the eventual winning run on a sacrifice fly...**Crunching the Numbers:** Little Falls is 2-6 at Vet's Park and 4-1 on the road...**Who's Hot:** Dave Wendt hit .400 in his first three games with the team. Nick Campbell (Bryant) posted a team-high seven hits and Mike Augustine (Boston College) drove in four runs.

**Niagara (1-5 week, 4-9 overall):** The Power snapped a six-game losing streak on Saturday night with a 6-5 victory over Webster...Even with a 1-5 record for the week, the Power offense managed to score 25 runs in six games and never had fewer than three runs. They have not been shut out in 13 games this year...Niagara was the lone Western Division team to play a game on every day, not including the division-wide off-day on Monday...Chris Hackett (Albany) made a team-high four relief appearances and went 1-1 with a 2.70 earned run average. He pitched three shutout innings against Webster on Saturday night to earn his first win...Catcher Tim Purdin (MidAmerica Nazarene) is currently riding a team-best seven-game hitting streak...Niagara is one of only three Western Division teams that have a win over first-place Hornell this season...**Crunching the Numbers:** Niagara is 0-6 away from Sal Maglie Stadium...**Who's Hot:** Nate Radtke (Cleveland State) hit .429 with three doubles, three runs scored and a .786 slugging percentage. Zach and Tyson Leighton combined for 10 hits and seven runs batted in.

**Saratoga (2-3 week, 5-9 overall):** J.D. Martinez (Nova Southeastern) broke a franchise record with his sixth home of the season on Thursday night, but the Phillies struggled to a 2-3 week. Martinez's sixth home run broke the previous mark of five set by his college teammate, Bryan Cook, last year...All five of Saratoga's games were decided by two runs or less...The Phils played their third straight extra-inning game in Watertown on Wednesday night and came away with a 7-5 victory in 11 innings. Tyler Biddix (Virginia) had a two-run single in the ninth...Jason Zinser (NC State) was added to the Phillies roster. He pitched three shutout innings in the 11-inning game at Watertown to earn a win. Zinser, from San Diego, Calif., transferred to NC State from UCLA...Reliever Sean Lucas (Virginia) allowed his first earned run of the year against Little Falls on Friday night. He had held opponents scoreless in five previous appearances...**Crunching the Numbers:** J.D. Martinez has tallied multiple hits in nine of the 12 games he's played in this season...**Who's Hot:** Tyler Biddix (Virginia), J.D. Martinez and Ty Hohman (Virginia Tech) all posted six hits, Biddix scored a team-high four runs. Josh Simmons (Wheaton, Mass.) struck out eight and earned a save in two appearances.
