##### **Brockport 4 Webster 3**

BROCKPORT, N.Y. – Kyle Harvey (Texas Lutheran) slammed a walk-off single in the bottom of the ninth inning to give the Riverbats their first win over the Yankees in 2008. David Ahonen (Ithaca) walked to start the frame and moved to third on back-to-back singles before scoring the winning run. Former Riverbat Steve Muoio (Monroe CC) had tied the game for the Yankees in the top of the ninth on a RBI single. Jesse Bosnik (St. Bonaventure) scored two of Brockport's four runs and Billy Herman (Slippery Rock) drove in two. Riverbats starter Aron Meindl (St. Bonaventure) allowed two runs on four hits over eight innings. John Kenny (Hofstra) paced the Pinstripes with one RBI and two runs scored.

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. – The Mohawks improved to 7-2 with a pair of Sunday wins over the Saratoga Phillies at East Side Recreation Park.

##### **Game 1 – Amsterdam 14 Saratoga 6**

The Mohawks scored eight unanswered runs to defeat the Phillies in a game resumed from June 10. Amsterdam trailed, 6-5, when the game was halted but erupted on Sunday with six runs between the fourth and fifth innings to take control. Amsterdam's Chris Bisson (Kentucky) and Mark Onorati (Manhattan) combined for six hits, five runs scored and three runs batted in. Sean Gregory (Albany) and Ben Asulp (LSU) held Saratoga to just four hits in the game's final seven innings. Saratoga's J.D. Martinez (Nova Southeastern) was 4-for-5 with two hits and two runs batted in.

##### **Game 2 – Amsterdam 6 Saratoga 3**

The division-leading Mohawks scored five runs over the first two innings and then held off a charge from the Phillies to earn their seventh victory. Brendan Rowland (Albany) and Nick Punal (Brown) drove in two runs apiece during the first inning. Saratoga rallied with two runs in the fourth but the Mohawks bullpen of Brennan Wojdyla (Marist), Josh Feit (Brown) and Rick Breymer (Pittsburgh) allowed one run on one hit in the game's final four innings. Brendan Rowland went 3-for-4 with two runs scored and Mike Spina (Cincinnati) had two hits and one RBI. Mike Moss (Maryland) drove in a run for Saratoga.

##### **Hornell 8 Geneva 2**

HORNELL, N.Y. – Jose Sanchez (Delaware State) went 3-for-4 with three runs scored and Trey Bennett (Mercyhurst) had three hits and two runs batted in as the Dodgers clipped the Red Wings at Maple City Park. Sanchez doubled and scored in his first two at-bats to help Hornell to a 2-0 lead. Bennett drove in one run apiece in the fifth and sixth innings as the Dodgers took a 6-1 edge. The Dodgers' league-leading offense has scored seven or more runs in six-straight games. Hornell starter Sean Toler (Missouri State) allowed two runs on four hits over six and two-thirds innings pitched to earn the win. John Sills (Holy Cross) posted two hits for Geneva and Jimmy Vahalik (Toledo) knocked in one run.

### Glens Falls 2 Little Falls 0

LITTLE FALLS, N.Y. – Scott Denault (San Diego) and Ricky Anaya (FAU) combined on a six-hit shutout as Glens Falls blanked Little Falls at Veteran's Park. Denault yielded five hits, walked three and struck out three over six and one-third innings pitched. Anaya held the Miners to one hit through the final two and two-thirds innings. Luis Feliz (Rutgers) scored on a RBI ground out by Jonathan Kosco (South Florida) to break a scoreless tie in the fifth. Jose Valerio (San Diego) plated the Golden Eagles' second run in the sixth; he finished 2-for-4. Andrew Stafford (Oakland) and Jeff Lieneck (Wheaton, Mass.) had two hits apiece for Little Falls.

### Allegany County 11 Bolivar 3

SCIO, N.Y. – Three Nitros pitchers combined on a three-hitter and Thomas Tolliver (Transylvania) went 3-for-4 with three RBI to lead the Nitros over the Athletics. Matt Miller (Eastern Illinois) limited Bolivar to two runs on three hits and Tim Kearney (Maryland) and Mike Londino (Delaware) each held the Athletics without a hit for the final two innings. Eight of nine Elmira starters had at least one hit and one run scored. Rye Davis (Western Kentucky) held Niagara scoreless for the first five innings and yielded two runs on six hits over six frames. Joe Durham (Samford) and Jeremy Webb (USC Beaufort) each drove in a run for Niagara.

### Bennington 4 Watertown 0

WATERTOWN, N.Y. – Mitchell Eilenberg (Massachusetts) and Ben Sonberg (Keene State) combined on a four-hit shutout and the Bombers scored four first-inning runs to end the Wizards three-game home winning streak. Eilenberg gave up three hits over seven innings and Sonberg yielded one hit in the final two innings. They combined to face four batters over the minimum. Bennington exploded for four runs in the first inning on three hits, three walks and a hit batter. After two bases-loaded walks and a hit batter brought three runs home, Michael Sudol (Boston College) capped off the rally with a RBI single. Dylan Stone (Bryant) and Joey Bergman (Charleston) had two hits apiece for Bennington. After a shaky first inning, Wizards starter Richard Armento (St. John's) gave up two hits in his final five innings of work.

## COLLEGE WORLD SERIES UPDATE

\*Fresno State's Ryan Overland (Little Falls '06) went 1-for-2 with a team-high three walks and three runs scored as the Bulldogs pounded Rice, 17-5, on Sunday afternoon. Overland walked and scored in the second, singled and scored and walked in the fourth and walked and scored in the sixth. Fresno State's 17 runs are the most any team has scored at the College World Series since Miami (Fla.) scored 21 in 2001 against Tennessee. The Bulldogs will play North Carolina in the winner's bracket on Tuesday.

\*Former NYCBL pitchers Brian Moran (Glens Falls '07) and Paul Bertuccini (Geneva '07) each pitched in short relief as North Carolina defeated LSU, 8-4, on Sunday night. Moran, a sophomore at North Carolina, pitched to four batters in the eighth inning and allowed one run on two hits. He walked one and struck out one in his 36th appearance of the season. Bertuccini, a sophomore at LSU, retired the only batter he faced, North Carolina clean-up hitter Tim Federowicz, in the fourth inning. LSU will play in the loser's bracket on Tuesday against Rice.
