##### **Bolivar 8 Niagara 5**

BOLIVAR, N.Y. – The Athletics erupted for six eighth-inning runs to earn a come-from-behind victory over the Power on a chilly night at Bolivar-Richburg High School. Bolivar's six runs, all unearned, were scored on three hits and three Niagara errors. Jay Cox (Skagit Valley CC) and Kevin Cope (UAB) had the lone RBI singles of the rally. Hayden Moss (Arizona State) and Cody Fuqua (Williams Baptist) each scored two runs for Bolivar and Jeremy Sprague (Patrick Henry CC) had a team-high two hits. Joel Blomberg (Embry-Riddle) was the top Power hitter with two RBI.

##### **Glens Falls 5 Saratoga 4**

GLEN FALLS, N.Y. – Jack Wagoner (Sacred Heart) allowed two runs on two hits over six innings and the Golden Eagles touched Mike Fiers (Nova Southeastern) for five runs to earn a Tuesday morning victory at East Field. Wagoner carried a no-hit bid into the sixth and retired 15 of the first 17 batters he faced. Glens Falls clumped together five runs over the third, fourth and fifth to take a commanding, 5-0, lead. Jonathan Kosco (South Florida) drove in two runs and scored another for Glens Falls and Luis Feliz (Rutgers) scored twice. Jonathan White (Vanderbilt) added a RBI triple. Tom Luciano (Duke) smashed a two-run double to lead the Phillies and Jordan Wormsley (Vanderbilt) knocked in one run.

##### **Bennington 5 Watertown 1**

BENNINGTON, Vt. – Five Bennington pitchers combined on a three-hitter and the Bombers scored five runs on nine hits to defeat the Wizards at Epstein Field. Matt Fyfee (Eastern Kentucky) allowed one run on two hits over five innings. Relievers James Niesuchouski (Lamar), Bryce DeWeese (Wright State), Ben Sonberg (Keene State) and Steve Cadoret (Boston College) each pitched a scoreless frame. Tristan Hobbes (ECSU) and Joey Bergman (Charleston) buoyed the Bomber offense with two hits each; Hobbes also drove in two runs. Casey Potter (Indianapolis) had two hits, two runs scored and one RBI.

ELMIRA, N.Y. – Brockport pushed across two runs in the 10th inning to win a wild game against Elmira at rain-swept Dunn Field. Elmira had rallied for five runs in the bottom of the ninth inning to tie the game and cap off a wild comeback from being down, 10-5.

## COLLEGE WORLD SERIES UPDATE

\*Ryan Overland (Little Falls '06) clouted a home run and Holden Sprague (Little Falls '06) pitched two and two-thirds scoreless innings of relief as Fresno State defeated North Carolina, 5-3, in a winner's bracket game on Tuesday night in Omaha, Neb. Overland crushed a solo belt in his first at-bat to give Fresno State a 1-0 lead. He finished 2-for-2. Holden Sprague entered in the sixth and held the Tar Heels scoreless until he left in the eighth inning. Sprague allowed three hits and struck out three. Brian Moran (Glens Falls '07) pitched in short relief for North Carolina. He yielded one hit and struck out one during the fifth inning.

\*Chris McGhee (Amsterdam '07) scored on Blake Dean's game-winning, three-run double as Louisiana State shocked Rice, 6-5, in an elimination game on Tuesday afternoon at Rosenblatt Stadium. McGhee entered the contest as a pinch runner in the ninth inning for Sean Ochinko. It was his first action of the World Series. Paul Bertuccini (Geneva '07) pitched in relief of starter Jared Bradford in the seventh inning. Bertuccini allowed two hits and struck out one to end the frame.
