GLENS FALLS, N.Y. – Kody Johnson (Pima CC) crushed a go-ahead, two-run home run in the eighth inning to lead the Golden Eagles over the Mohawks in a see-saw game at East Field. Johnson's two-run belt to left-center field erased a 7-6 Amsterdam lead. Marc Damon (Pima CC) closed out the game in the ninth with his third save in three chances. The contest featured three ties, 21 hits and four home runs. Each team played with but could not hold the lead. Kody Johnson went 3-for-4 with three runs scored and two RBI, Nick McCoy (San Diego) had three hits and three runs batted in and Stefen Romero (Pima) walked thrice and scored twice for Glens Falls. Mark Onorati (Manhattan) belted a three-run home run for the Mohawks while Brendan Rowland (Albany) and Cody Reine (LSU) each slugged solo home runs.

Saratoga 7 Watertown 5 (11)

WATERTOWN, N.Y. – Tyler Biddix (Virginia) smashed a two-run single in the 11th inning as the Phillies handed the Wizards an extra-inning defeat at Duffy Fairgrounds. Biddix collected an infield hit to score Dennis O'Grady (Duke) and Dale Alberto (Nova Southeastern) with the game's decisive runs. Saratoga plated six unanswered runs after getting behind, 5-1. Miles Mikolas (Nova Southeastern), Jason Zinser (NC State) and Dave Batchelder (Saint Peter's) held the Wizards to just two hits in the game's final nine frames. NIAGARA FALLS, N.Y. – Kevin Cope (UAB) went 3-for-5 with two RBI to help Bolivar to its second-straight win over Niagara. Cope keyed a three-run Bolivar rally in the second with a RBI single and a run scored as Bolivar grabbed a 3-1 lead. He also doubled home a run in the seventh. Niagara rallied from a 5-2 deficit with two runs in the eighth but could not push the tying run across. Bolivar pitchers stranded 11 Power runners on base and left the bases loaded to end the game. Nate Radtke (Cleveland State) was Niagara's top batter with three hits and one RBI. Joel Blomberg (Embry-Riddle) went 2-for-3 with two runs scored and Drew Hollinghead (Mississippi State) was 3-for-3. For Bolivar, Coby Cress (Arizona State) was 1-for-1 with a pinch-hit single and he scored the eventual game-winning run on a wild pitch in the seventh.

*Mike Zaccardo (Genesee Valley '04) and John Allman (Amsterdam '04) have signed with Major League Baseball teams as non-drafted free agents. Zaccardo inked a deal with the Philadelphia Phillies. He's expected to report to the New York-Penn League's Williamsport Crosscutters where he will join former NYCBL pitcher Michael Schwimer (Saratoga '05). The Cleveland Indians tabbed John Allman to a minor-league pact. Allman was still awaiting assignment at press time.

*Ashton Mowdy (Geneva '07) and David Flores (Little Falls '06) led the Tri-City Valley Cats to a 7-6 victory in 11 innings over the Lowell Spinners on Wednesday night in Lowell, Mass. Mowdy earned his first professional victory with two scoreless innings of relief. He entered in the 10th, allowed one hit and struck out four. Flores, in his professional debut, went 3-for-5 with a home run, two RBI and a double. He doubled in his first professional at-bat and then slugged a solo home run in the fourth inning. The former Diamond Miner capped off a three-run Tri-City rally in the eighth with a RBI single.

*Five former NYCBL players are looking to take the Big Apple by storm. The Brooklyn Cyclones roster features four NYCBL alums including Matthew Bouchard (Plattsburgh '05), Michael Parker (Amsterdam '04), Zachary Lutz (Hornell '07) and recent draft pick Eric Beaulac (Amsterdam '06-'07). Over on Staten Island, former NYCBL slugger Mike Lyon (Watertown '05) is a member of the Staten Island Yankees. The Cyclones have two-straight wins over the Yankees to start the season. Last night, Lutz went 2-for-3 with two doubles, two RBI and two runs scored as the Mets affiliate defeated the Yankees affiliate, 9-4, at the Richmond County Bank Ballpark. Lutz was a fifth-round selection of the Metropolitan last year. He is hitting .500 over the Cyclones first two games this year. Matt Bouchard added one hit and one run scored. David Williams (Glens Falls '04-'05) played for the Staten Island Yankees last year.

*Ryan Quigley (Watertown '07) and Steve Kalush (Watertown '07) pitched the Harwich Mariners to a 4-1 win on Tuesday night over the Chatham Athletics in Cape Cod Baseball League action. Quigley, in his Cape League debut at historic Veteran's Field, pitched a four-hit shutout over six innings, walked four and struck out 11. Kalush pitched one scoreless inning of relief and struck out two. Quigley is tied for the league-lead in strikeouts and the Mariners are off to a 3-1 start.

*Andrew Carraway (Saratoga '06) started the home opener for the Cape League's Hyannis Mets and earned a 1-0 victory over the Falmouth Commodores. Carraway allowed four hits over five and one-third innings pitched, walked none and struck out seven. He faced four batters over the minimum.

COLLEGE WORLD SERIES UPDATE

*Stanford's Cord Phelps (Amsterdam '06) went 3-for-5 with two RBI and one run scored as the Cardinal defeated Miami (Fla.), 8-3, in an elimination game on Wednesday night at Johnny Rosenblatt Stadium in Omaha, Neb. Phelps, a third-round pick of the Cleveland Indians in the 2008 draft, singled, doubled and tripled to lead Stanford's 11-hit attack. After recording a single in the first, Phelps doubled and scored in the third to put Stanford ahead, 1-0. He capped off a four-run fifth inning with a two-run triple as the Cardinal built a 7-0 lead. Stanford will play Georgia on Friday afternoon at 1:00 PM.
