Allegany County 3 Hornell 1

HORNELL, N.Y. – Joe Scarlata (Columbia) pitched a complete-game four-hitter to lead Allegany County past Hornell at Maple City Park. Scarlata allowed one run on four hits, walked one and struck out six in the nine-inning effort. The Nitros plated a single run in the third on one hit and two runs in the sixth on three hits, an error and a wild pitch. Kyle Davis (Delaware) and Josh Wierzba (Toledo) each had one hit and one run scored for Allegany County and Alex Raetzloff (Webster) drove in one run. Adam Eggemeyer (SIU Edwardsville) doubled in the seventh inning and scored on a Trey Bennett (Mercyhurst) RBI single for Hornell's lone run.

Brockport 14 Bolivar 9

BOLIVAR, N.Y. – The red-hot Riverbats struck for 14 runs on 18 hits to outslug the Athletics on Thursday night at Bolivar-Richburg. Brockport plated 13 of its 14 runs over the first four innings, highlighted by a pair of five-run frames in the first and second. Bolivar rallied for six runs in the seventh and eighth but could not get closer than five. Ryan Nokelby (Texas Lutheran) and Andrew Dewing (ECSU) each drove in three runs for the Riverbats while Billy Herman (Slippery Rock) and Corey Taylor (Binghamton) scored three runs apiece. David Ahonen (Ithaca) had a team-high four hits to pace five different 'Bats with multi-hit games. For Bolivar, Michael Fear (Morehead State) went 3-for-4 with one RBI and Josh Kubsinski (Cypress) had a two-run single.

Brockport 9 Bolivar 5 (Resumed from 6/13)

BOLIVAR, N.Y. – Brockport used a three-run seventh inning and three scoreless innings of relief from David Gagnon (Clark) and Aron Meindl (St. Bonaventure) to earn a victory over Bolivar. The game started in Brockport, N.Y., on June 13 but was halted in the seventh inning with Brockport leading, 6-5. After the resumption, Gagnon worked a scoreless seventh and then Brockport scored three quick runs on a Jared Hood (Texas-Tyler) two-run double and an Eric Guillen (USC Upstate) RBI single. Meindl allowed two hits over the final two innings. Guillen finished 3-for-4 with two RBI, Hood drove in two runs and David Ahonen (Ithaca) scored twice. Gabe Grinder (Indiana, Pa.) had a team-high three hits for Bolivar while Hayden Moss (Arizona State) and Jacob Avey (Skagit Valley CC) each plated two runs.

Saratoga 3 Little Falls 1

LITTLE FALLS, N.Y. – Four Saratoga pitchers combined on a four-hitter and the Phillies slugged two home runs to win their second-straight game. Saratoga starter Eric Potter (Maryland) hurled a three-hit shutout over six innings. Taylor McKinney (Oklahoma State), Sean Lucas (Virginia) and Josh Simmons (Wheaton, Mass.) held the Miners to one run on one hit in the final three innings. Dale Alberto (Nova Southeastern) broke a scoreless tie in the third with a solo home run. J.D. Martinez (Nova Southeastern) broke a Phillies single-season franchise record with his sixth home run of the season, a solo belt in the fourth. Alberto plated an insurance run in the ninth to finish 1-for-2 with two RBI; Martinez had two hits, one RBI and one run scored. Nick Campbell (Bryant) and Rick Hoogstraten (Radford) each collected two hits for Little Falls.

In the spring, he pitched the Lions to the Ivy League title.

GLENS FALLS, N.Y. – Kody Johnson (Pima CC) scored on a bases-loaded walk in the bottom of the 10th inning to give the Golden Eagles their second win over the Wizards in less than a week. Johnson singled to start the 10th, moved to second on a sacrifice and went to third after a walk and a hit batsman. Todd Brazeal (South Florida) drew a bases-loaded free pass from Wizards reliever Tate Kelly (West Virginia) to end the game. Brazeal led all Golden Eagles' batters with two hits and three RBI. Luis Feliz (Rutgers) added two hits and Jonathan Kosco (South Florida) scored two runs. All four of the Wizards tallies came during a four-run fourth inning. Jake Gorman (Holy Cross) drove in two runs with a RBI double and went 2-for-4. Reid Chenworth (Maryland) was 2-for-3 with one RBI and Keli'i Zablan (Southern Utah) had two hits.
