##### Brockport 5 Elmira 4 (12)

BROCKPORT, N.Y. – Corey Taylor (Binghamton) scored on a wild pitch in the bottom of the 12th inning to give the Riverbats their eighth-straight win. Taylor singled to start the frame, moved to second on a Jeremy Macklin (Huston-Tillotson) bunt single and went to third on a walk. The two teams combined for four ninth-inning runs to force the extra session. Elmira erased a 3-1 deficit with three tallies in the ninth on a Nick Messinger (Pace) two-run double and a Drew Morgan (Western Kentucky) RBI single. An Elmira error in the bottom of the frame tied the game for the R-Bats. Taylor was 3-for-6 with two RBI for Brockport and Kyle Harvey (Texas Lutheran) scored three runs. Messinger paced the Pios with two hits and Rye Davis (Western Kentucky) belted a solo home run.

##### Hornell 3 Webster 1 (Resumed from 6/17)

ROCHESTER, N.Y. – The Dodgers used two first-inning runs and a four-hitter over seven innings from Daniel Tunison (LeMoyne) to best the Yankees at R.I.T. Field. The game was started on Tuesday but halted because of inclement weather. Prior to the stoppage, Abe Steinbach (Emporia State) ripped a two-run single to give Hornell a 2-0 lead. Saturday, Dan Tunison allowed one unearned run on four hits, walked one and struck out seven. Webster had the tying run on base in the ninth but Hornell's Josh Goodin (William Woods) stranded him on to end the game. Adam Gray (Mercyhurst) and Zach Kinkeade (St. Charles CC) had three hits apiece for the Blue and White and Adam Eggemeyer (SIU Edwardsville) had one RBI and one run scored. Ryan Chenoweth (Ball State) and Steve Muoio (Monroe CC) each had two hits for the Yankees.

##### Hornell 3 Webster 2

ROCHESTER, N.Y. – Adam Schrader (SW Minnesota State) and J.C. Casey (Missouri State) combined on a six-hitter and the Dodgers plated single runs in the third, sixth and seventh to edge the Yankees. Schrader yielded one run on four hits over six innings and struck out six. Casey fanned four in three innings and let in one run on two hits. Hornell would never trail after taking a 1-0 lead on an Adam Gray (Mercyhurst) sacrifice fly in the third inning. Adam Eggemeyer (SIU Edwardsville) and Greg Laughlin (SW Minnesota State) also drove in one run each for the Dodgers. Webster's Geoff Dornes (R.I.T.) was 2-for-3 with a RBI single and a RBI double.

##### Little Falls 8 Saratoga 7

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. – The Miners scored two runs in the ninth inning to shock the Phillies at East Side Rec. The win is Little Falls' first in Saratoga since the then Diamond Miners defeated the Phillies, 6-5, on July 9, 2006. A Saratoga throwing error and a Dave Wendt (Dowling) sacrifice fly pushed across two Little Falls' runs to erase a 7-6 Phillies lead. Eric Fama (Rhode Island College) pitched a scoreless ninth to earn his third save. The wild game featured four lead changes and six different pitchers. For Little Falls, Dave Wendt was 3-for-4 with two RBI and Mike Augustine (Boston College) had two hits and two runs batted in. Mike Moss (Maryland) paced the Phillies with two hits and three RBI and Kyle Meyer (Marist) drove in two Saratoga runs.

### Amsterdam 12 Watertown 1

AMSTERDAM, N.Y. – The Mohawks erupted for 12 runs on 11 hits to crush the Wizards in front of 1,936 fans at Shuttleworth Park. Amsterdam scored seven runs in the second and four in the third to wash away a 1-0 Watertown lead. Four Mohawks recorded multi-hit games led by Spencer Korus (Kentucky) and Chris Bisson (Kentucky) with three hits apiece. Ricky Pacione (Marist) drove in a team-high four runs and scored two while Mark Onorati (Manhattan) was 2-for-4 with two RBI and three runs scored. Amsterdam starter Dan Forman allowed one run on six hits over six innings and struck out six. Watertown's second-inning run on a Greg Herbst (Kansas) RBI single was the first earned run Forman has allowed in three starts.

### Allegany County 7 Niagara 3

NIAGARA FALLS, N.Y. – Aaron Hallett (Davis and Elkins) and Josh Wierzba (Toledo) combined to drive in five runs and Nick Vallillo (Monmouth) allowed three runs in seven innings as the Nitros shut down the Power at Sal Maglie Stadium. Hallett smashed a two-run double in the third to help Allegany County to a 3-0 lead. Wierzba increased a one-run Nitros' lead to four in the ninth with a three-run double. McGrath paced a 13-hit Red Wings attack with two singles, two runs scored and a two-run home run. The Wings clumped together 10 of their 11 runs between the third and sixth innings. Bolivar rallied for five runs in the ninth before Geneva reliever Jason Koziol (George Mason) forced a game-ending ground out. Jimmy Vahalik (Toledo) and Kyle Eastham (South Florida) plated two runs apiece for Geneva and Chris Alteri (FIU) walked twice and scored twice. Jay Cox (Florence-Darlington) had two hits and two runs scored for Bolivar and Michael Fear (Morehead State) had two RBI.

\*Brian Moran (Glens Falls '07) struck out three in short relief and Tim Federowicz smashed a ninth-inning grand slam to propel North Carolina to a 7-3 victory over Louisiana State in an elimination game on Friday night at Johnny Rosenblatt Stadium. The Tar Heels will play Fresno State on Saturday night at 6:00 PM in the first game of the bracket two championship round. Moran entered the game with two outs in the fifth and struck out Jared Mitchell to strand two LSU runners on base. The former Glens Falls hurler retired three of five batters he faced in the sixth inning to end his appearance.
