### ABOUT LAST NIGHT

#### Amsterdam 10 Watertown 9

AMSTERDAM, N.Y. – The first-place Mohawks rallied from a 4-0 deficit and then had to hold off a late Wizards surge to earn a wild victory at Shuttleworth Park. Amsterdam scored 10-straight runs, including six in the fifth inning, to erase Watertown's lead. The Wizards registered four runs in the ninth but could not record the tying tally against Mohawks closer Ricky Breymer (Pittsburgh). The Friday-night affair featured 19 runs, 27 hits, five errors and seven pitchers. Five different Mohawks recorded multi-hit games led by Spencer Korus (Kentucky) who was 3-for-5 with two doubles and two runs scored. Mark Onorati (Manhattan) and Chris Bisson (Kentucky) each homered for the Mohawks. Watertown's Jordan Kreke (Eastern Illinois) and Jake Gorman (Holy Cross) each posted three hits; Gorman scored three runs and Kreke drove in two. Derek Marshall (Saint Rose) added two hits and three RBI.

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. – The Phillies swept a two-night doubleheader from the Bombers at East Side Recreation Park.

**Game 1** – Three Saratoga pitchers combined on a four-hitter and Vince Farfaglia (Francis Marion) accounted for two of Saratoga's three runs as the Phils earned their 100th victory in franchise history. Starter Eric Potter (Maryland) allowed one unearned run on three hits in four and one-thirds innings pitched. Relievers Sean Lucas (Virginia) and Josh Simmons (Wheaton, Mass.) held Bennington to one hit over the final two and two-thirds innings. Farfaglia scored on a Bennington error in the fifth to break a 1-1 tie and then plated an insurance run in the sixth with a RBI single. Joey Bergman (Charleston) drove in Bennington's only run.

**Game 2** – Ty Hohman (Virginia Tech) went 2-for-3 with two runs scored and J.D. Martinez (Nova Southeastern) blasted a two-run triple to give the Phillies a win in the night cap. Hohman singled and scored in each of his first two at-bats to give Saratoga a 2-1 lead. Martinez increased Saratoga's advantage to three in the fifth with a two-run triple. Bennington rallied for two runs in the sixth before relievers David Batchelder (Saint Peter's) and Jason Zinser (NC State) combined to sit down the next five Bennington batters to end the game. Joey Bergman (Charleston) led the Bombers' offense with two hits and two runs scored.

#### Hornell 11 Niagara 3

NIAGARA FALLS, N.Y. – Andrew Jesse (St. Joseph's, Ind.) crushed a grand slam and the Dodgers reeled off six runs in the second inning in a rout of the Power. Jesse's grand slam erased a 2-1 Niagara lead. Later in the inning, Adam Eggemeyer (SIU Edwardsville) lashed a two-run single to put the Dodgers ahead, 7-2. Hornell totaled 11 runs for the game on 11 hits and six Niagara errors. Four different Dodgers posted multiple hit games led by Adam Gray (Mercyhurst) who went 2-for-4 with a game-high four runs scored. Sean Toler (Missouri State) struck out seven and yielded three runs in seven innings for the Blue and White. Joe Durham (Samford) totaled three hits to lead Niagara.

### Glens Falls 6 Little Falls 1 (Resumed from 6/14)

#### Little Falls 3 Glens Falls 2

GLENS FALLS, N.Y. – The Miners and the Golden Eagles split a non-traditional doubleheader at East Field.

**Game 1** – Glens Falls clumped together six runs over the middle innings and Caleb Strickland (Okaloosa Walton) allowed one run over five and two-thirds innings as the Golden Eagles triumphed in the opener. The game had been originally started on June 14. Mike Augustine (Boston College) smashed a solo home run for Little Falls in the fourth and Glens Falls responded with three runs each in the fourth and sixth innings to take control. Strickland yielded one run on five hits and struck out six in his first NYCBL appearance. Curt Courtwright (Missouri State) drove in two runs for Glens Falls and Jose Valerio (San Diego) went 2-for-3 with one RBI and one run scored.

**Game 2** – Three Little Falls pitchers combined on a four-hitter and the Miners put together three runs over the middle innings to earn the split. Jared Freni (Massachusetts) allowed two runs on three hits and struck out eight over five and two-thirds innings pitched. Jake Arendsen (Oakland) and Eric Fama (Rhode Island College) limited Glens Falls to one hit and combined to strike out seven over the final two and one-third innings. Little Falls scored single runs in the fourth and fifth to take a 2-0 lead. Glens Falls' Stefen Romero (Pima CC) tied the game with a two-run double in the bottom of the fifth. Taylor Traub (Oakland) plated Mike Augustine (Boston College) with a RBI double in the sixth give the Miners a one-run edge. Augustine and Traub each finished with two hits. Stefen Romero and Chad Stang (Midland) had two hits apiece for Glens Falls.

### Brockport 9 Bolivar 8 (10) (Game 1)

BROCKPORT, N.Y. – Brockport scored 17 runs over 19 innings to sweep a near six-hour twin bill from Bolivar at SUNY Brockport's Whited Baseball Complex.

**Game 1** – Andrew Dewing (ECSU) hit a walk-off single in the 10th inning as Brockport rallied to defeat Bolivar in an extra session. The Riverbats plated two runs in the 10th to overcome an 8-7 deficit. Ryan Nokelby (Texas Lutheran) tied the contest with a RBI double and scored on Dewing's game-winning hit.

Brockport led much of the game until Bolivar exploded for a six-run eighth that was highlighted by a Hayden Moss (Arizona State) three-run double. The Riverbats plated two in the bottom half of the inning to force the extra session. Andrew Dewing, Ryan Nokelby and Kyle Harvey (Texas Lutheran) all had three RBI for Brockport. Bolivar was led by Jeremy Sprague (Patrick Henry CC) who went 4-for-5 with one RBI.

**Game 2** – Tom Fishback (Ithaca) whirled a four-hit shutout over eight innings and Corey Taylor (Binghamton) went 3-for-4 with four RBI as the Riverbats won the night cap. Fishback scattered four Bolivar hits, walked three and struck out nine. Taylor singled home a run in the third, swatted a two-run hit in the fifth and lofted a solo home run in the eighth. Billy Herman (Slippery Rock) and Eric Guillen (USC Upstate) each added three hits while Ryan Nokelby (TLU) and Jesse Bosnik (St. Bonaventure) registered two hits and two runs apiece.

ROCHESTER, N.Y. – The Yankees scored eight-straight runs to earn a home victory over the Pioneers at R.I.T. Field. Elmira had a 2-0 lead after two innings. Webster plated three in the third, three in the fifth and then single runs in the sixth and seventh. T.J. Baumet (Ball State) tripled home two runs in the third to tie the game and then scored the go-ahead run on a Mark Wiggins' (UMass Lowell) ground out.
