BROCKPORT, N.Y. – Jesse Bosnik (St. Bonaventure) went 2-for-4 with three runs batted in and Ryan O'Rourke (Merrimack) allowed one run over six and one-third innings pitched as the Riverbats defeated the Nitros on Saturday afternoon at SUNY Brockport's Clark V. Whited Baseball Complex. Bosnik ripped a RBI single and scored in the first and then blasted a two-run home run in the fourth. O'Rourke held the Nitros to one run on five hits, walked two and struck out nine. He fanned at least one batter in each of his first six innings pitched. Scott McNee (W.P.I.), making his NYCBL debut, belted a pinch-hit, solo home run for the Nitros.

Elmira 3 Hornell 3 – HALTED, Bottom 9

HORNELL, N.Y. – Hornell had runners on the corners with two outs in the bottom of the ninth when lightning halted play at Maple City Park. The game will be resumed in Hornell on July 23. For Hornell, Adam Eggemeyer (SIU Edwardsville) was 2-for-3 with two triples and one RBI. Mike Perkins (UNC-Charlotte), Rye Davis (Western Kentucky) and Mike Mergenthaler (Richmond) all drove in one run for the Pioneers.

Jesse Bosnik, Brockport Riverbats

St. Bonaventure University

Jesse Bosnik accounted for all four of Brockport's runs in a Saturday afternoon victory over Allegany County. Bosnik tripled home the 'Bats first run in the first inning and then scored on a ground out. He clouted a two-run home run in the third inning to put Brockport ahead, 4-0. This summer, Bosnik leads the Riverbats in batting average (.365), hits (27), runs scored (18) and doubles (7). He is a rising sophomore at St. Bonaventure University. Prior to college, Bosnik was a star basketball player in Saint Mary's Pa. He scored a school-record 2,083 points at Elk County Catholic and was a two-time all-state selection.

*Chris Edmondson (Watertown '07) is currently among the top hitters in the New England Collegiate Baseball League. He plays for the NECBL's Pittsfield Dukes. Through 16 games, Edmondson is batting .379 with a league-high 25 hits and three triples. He has accumulated 15 runs scored, two home runs, 12 RBI, three doubles, seven walks, a .606 slugging percentage and a .438 on-base percentage. His older brother, Jerod (Ithaca '03), is currently playing for the Can-Am League's Nashua Pride.

*Matt Jansen (Watertown '07) is enjoying a successful summer with the Madison Mallards of the Northwoods League. Jansen is 2-0 with a 1.13 earned run average in six appearances. The southpaw has allowed four earned runs in 32 innings pitched, walked nine and struck out 20.

*The Toronto Blue Jays have promoted pitcher James Dougher (MV '04/Glens Falls '05) to the Class-A Lansing Lugnuts of the Midwest League. After spending time in extended spring training, Dougher joined the New York-Penn League's Auburn Doubledays. He made two scoreless appearances for Auburn and struck out five. The 6-foot-7 pitcher whirled a scoreless frame for Lansing against West Michigan on Friday night.

*The Detroit Tigers have promoted pitcher Thad Weber (Alfred '04) to the Class-A West Michigan Whitecaps of the Midwest League. Weber, after being drafted by the Tigers in June, joined the GCL Tigers of the Gulf Coast League. He struck out nine in two scoreless appearances. Weber is a West Michigan teammate of Chris Carlson (Glens Falls '04).

*Andrew Weimer (Rome '01) leads the independent Can-Am League with 10 saves. Weimer pitches for the Nashua Pride. He is 0-1 with a 2.35 earned run average in 15 appearances. Weimer has pitched 15.1 innings and held Can-Am League hitters to a .254 batting average. The former Rome Indian has saved more than half of Nashua's wins. He pitched for the now-defunct New Haven County Cutters in 2007.
