BENNINGTON, Vt. - Andrew Quinn (Assumption) allowed two runs over seven innings and the Bombers struck for nine unanswered runs to knock off the first-place Mohawks. Quinn yielded two first-frame scores and then held Amsterdam to five hits over the next six innings. Casey Potter (Indianapolis) ripped a three-run double to highlight a four-run first for Bennington. The Bombers scored one in the second, one in the fourth and three in the sixth. Jeff Bercume (Merrimack) was 3-for-4 with three runs scored and two RBI and Rudy Jovanovski (Ouachita Baptist) went 2-for-3 with three runs batted in to lead the Bombers. Mike Spina (Cincinnati) and Ricky Pacione (Marist) had three hits apiece to pace the Mohawks.

Hornell 8 Geneva 6

HORNELL, N.Y. - The Dodgers scored four runs over their final four at-bats to rally past the Red Wings in a back-and-forth game at Maple City Park. Geneva plated four runs in the top of the fifth to take a 6-4 lead. Brett Lancaster (SIU Edwardsville) ripped a RBI double in the fifth and Jose Sanchez (Delaware State) scored on a double steal in the sixth to tie the game. Adam Gray (Mercyhurst) tallied the go-ahead run for Hornell on Geneva's fourth error of the game in the sixth inning. Relievers J.C. Casey (Missouri State) and Josh Goodin (William Woods) shut out Geneva over the final four and two-thirds innings. For the Red Wings, Matt Perry (Holy Cross) went 2-for-3 with two RBI and Kevin McGrath (West Chester) posted a game-high three hits.

Webster scored single runs in the first and third, erupted for a five-run fourth and tacked on a single run in the eighth before the rains came. For Webster, Geoff Dornes (R.I.T.) went 3-for-4 with two RBI, Drew Hormann (Miami, Ohio) was 3-for-3 with a home run and Steve Muoio (Monroe CC) had two hits and two runs scored. Justin Tucker (Sinclair CC) posted two of Niagara's five hits.

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. - Little Falls plated six-straight runs to earn its second victory of the season at East Side Recreation Park. ELMIRA, N.Y. – The Pioneers posted a trio of victories over the Athletics at Dunn Field on Sunday afternoon. Two of the three wins came in resumed games.

Game 1 – Elmira scored a run in the top of the seventh and three pitchers combined to one-hit Bolivar over the final three innings as the Pioneers won the opener. The game was halted in the top of the seventh on June 8 with Elmira leading, 5-4. After the resumption, the Pios loaded the bases and Casey Brett (Cornell) drew a walk to force home a run. Jay Embree (Eastern Kentucky), Cody Dearth (Youngstown State) and Bernard Johnson (Corning CC) each pitched a scoreless frame for Elmira.

Game 2 – Mike Mastrogiovanni (Pace) and Bernard Johnson retired five-straight Bolivar batters and Mike Armstrong (Ithaca) ripped a ninth-inning RBI single to give Elmira its second win of the day. The game was originally halted on June 22 in the eighth inning with Elmira leading, 2-0. Mastrogiovanni closed out the eighth and Johnson fanned two of three he faced in the ninth. Armstrong cushioned Elmira's lead with a run-scoring single in the eighth.

Game 3 – Rye Davis (Western Kentucky) pitched a four-hitter over six innings and the Pioneers exploded for six runs in the fifth inning to down the Athletics. Davis allowed one run, walked one and struck out eight. Elmira led, 2-0, after two innings and then the Pioneers reeled off six runs on six hits in the fifth inning to put the game away. Devin Burch (Oneonta State) had a game-high three hits, J.J. Edwards (Sacred Heart) went 2-for-4 with two RBI and two runs scored and Ryan Price (Saint Rose) was 2-for-3 and drove in two runs.

Brockport 9 Allegany County 4

SCIO, N.Y. – The Riverbats recorded seven runs over the first three innings to fly past the Nitros at Scio Central School. Brockport plated three in the first, two in the second and two in the third to take a 7-2 lead. Ryan Nokelby (Texas Lutheran) singled and scored in each of the first two innings and then brought home another run in the third. Nokelby went 2-for-4 with two runs, Jeff Abrams (Binghamton) was 3-for-5 with three runs scored and Kyle Harvey (Texas Lutheran) had three hits, one RBI and one run scored. Thomas Tolliver (Transylvania), Ryan Holley (Binghamton) and Matthew Kempin (Des Moines Area CC) all had two hits for the Nitros; Tolliver drove in two runs and scored two more.

DID YOU KNOW?

Amsterdam's Jon DeLuca (Cincinnati) was named the Most Valuable Player of the 2005 NYCBL All-Star Game. DeLuca went 3-for-5 with two runs batted in and one run scored as the East defeated the West, 9-3, at Colburn Park in Newark, N.Y. He started the contest at shortstop and played the entire nine-inning game. DeLuca plated single runs in the sixth and ninth and also walked and scored in the eighth. At the end of the season, DeLuca was named second-team All-NYCBL.
