#### Brockport 12 Hornell 1 (Game 1)

#### Brockport 4 Hornell 3 (Game 2)

BROCKPORT, N.Y. – The red-hot Riverbats swept a Wednesday twin bill from the first-place Dodgers at SUNY Brockport.

**Game 1** – Brockport erupted for 12-unanswered runs to end first-place Hornell's six-game winning streak. Hornell led, 1-0, before Brockport's 12-run explosion between the fourth and eighth innings. The 'Bats plated two in the fourth, three in the fifth, four in the sixth and three in the eighth. Jesse Bosnik (St. Bonaventure) went 3-for-4 with two runs scored and one RBI, Corey Taylor (Binghamton) drove in a game-high four runs and Jeff Abrams (Binghamton) was 2-for-4 with two runs scored and two RBI. Brockport starter P.J. Saporito (New Jersey Tech) held Hornell to one run on six hits over seven innings and struck out five.

**Game 2** – Kyle Harvey (Texas Lutheran) ripped a two-out RBI single in the eighth inning to lead the Riverbats to their eighth-straight win.

Richard Royal (South Carolina) walked to start the inning, stole second and scored on Harvey's base hit to break a 3-3 tie. Hornell had drawn even with Brockport at three in the seventh inning on a Jose Sanchez (Delaware State) RBI triple and an Adam Eggemeyer (SIU Edwardsville) sacrifice fly. For Brockport, Jared Hood (Texas-Tyler) was 2-for-3 with two RBI and Corey Taylor (Binghamton) had three hits, one run scored and one run batted in. Greg Laughlin (SW Minnesota State) recorded a team-high three hits for Hornell, Adam Eggemeyer drove in two runs and Jose Sanchez scored two runs.

#### Glens Falls 3 Watertown 0

WATERTOWN, N.Y. – Scott Denault (San Diego) pitched a complete-game two-hit shutout and Jose Valerio (San Diego) went 2-for-3 with three RBI to lead the Golden Eagles past the Wizards. Denault walked one, struck out six and retired 26 of 30 batters he faced. Valerio broke a scoreless tie in the sixth inning with a two-run double and he doubled home another run in the seventh. Luis Feliz (Rutgers), Stefen Romero (Pima CC) and Todd Brazeal (South Florida) each had two hits for the Golden Eagles; Brazeal scored one run. Khyle Dimino (Cortland State) and Curtis Lazar (Maryland) had one hit apiece for Watertown.

#### Saratoga 7 Amsterdam 1

AMSTERDAM, N.Y. – Miles Mikolas (Nova Southeastern) allowed one run over six and two-thirds innings pitched and the Phillies strung together seven runs on nine hits to beat the Mohawks at Shuttleworth Park. Mikolas scattered six hits, walked one and struck out five in his first win of the summer. Saratoga scored single runs in the second and third and then answered Amsterdam's lone tally with five runs over the final four innings. For Saratoga, J.D. Martinez (Nova Southeastern) was 2-for-4 with one RBI, Chris Buss (Old Dominion) slammed a solo home run and Dominique Rodgers (NC State) belted a three-run double in the eighth. Brendan Rowland (Albany) and Dave Giuliani (Stanford) each had two hits for the Mohawks.

### Bolivar 9 Allegany County 2

BOLIVAR, N.Y. – The Athletics scored nine-straight unanswered runs to upend the Nitros at Bolivar-Richburg High School on Wednesday night. Allegany County led, 2-0, after three innings. Bolivar tied the game with two runs in the fourth and then took the lead with a six-run fifth inning. Bolivar's six runs scored on six hits and three Allegany County errors. Eight Athletics had at least one hit and five posted multi-hit games. Cody Fuqua (Williams Baptist) went 2-for-5 with two RBI and two runs scored, Jay Cox (Florence-Darlington) was 2-for-3 with two runs tallied and Coby Cress (Arizona State) had two hits and one RBI. Craig Page (Lyon) allowed two runs on six hits in six innings pitched to earn the win. Ryan Holley (Binghamton) had a two-run triple for Allegany County.

### Geneva 9 Elmira 4

GENEVA, N.Y. – Matt Perry (Holy Cross) was 4-for-5 with three RBI and the Red Wings scored runs in bunches early and late to sweep a home-and-home series with the Pioneers. Perry singled and scored in a three-run first inning and smashed a two-run single to highlight a four-run eighth frame. Aaron Greenblatt (Northeastern) allowed three runs on five hits, walked three and struck out five to earn the victory. Elmira yielded three runs in the first inning and was never closer than two. For the Red Wings, John Sills (Holy Cross) had two hits and two RBI and Bill Cupelo (Holy Cross) scored two runs. Trevor Wolf (Ithaca) drove in two runs for the Pioneers and Mike Perkins (UNC-Charlotte) was 2-for-4 with one RBI and one run scored.

### Webster 10 Niagara 1

NIAGARA FALLS, N.Y. – Webster scored seven runs over the first two innings en route to a victory over Niagara at Sal Maglie Stadium. The Pinstripes plated two runs in the first and five in the second. Webster's five-run second inning was capped off by a two-run single from Cory Brownsten (Pittsburgh). Yankee pitchers Dustin Ramey (UMass Lowell) and Jacob Bernath (Toledo) held the Power scoreless over the first eight innings and yielded only four hits. Niagara's Ben Lillis (North Greenville) drove in the Power's lone run in the ninth.

### Little Falls 8 Bennington 5

BENNINGTON, Vt. – Little Falls scored three runs in the ninth inning to edge Bennington in a back-and-forth game at Southern Vermont College on Wednesday night. The Miners' three tallies in the ninth broke a 5-5 tie. The see-saw game saw Bennington rally back from deficits of 4-0 and 5-4. Jeff Bercume (Merrimack) tied the game at five for the Bombers with a RBI single in the eighth inning. Bennington loaded the bases in the ninth but could not score the tying run against Little Falls reliever Nate Bayuk (Boston College).

## DID YOU KNOW

The Amsterdam Mohawks have not won a game at Alex T. Duffy Fairgrounds over the Watertown Wizards since game two of the 2005 Eastern Division playoffs. The Mohawks defeated the Wizards, 4-2, on August 2, 2005 to force a winner-take-all third game in the best-of-three series. Since then, Amsterdam has not won in Watertown. The Mohawks last regular-season victory over the Wizards at the Fairgrounds was on July 7, 2005. Amsterdam did defeat Watertown in the North Country last year, but it was a July game played at Indian River High School in Philadelphia, N.Y.
