Amsterdam 12 Watertown 8 (11)

WATERTOWN, N.Y. – Amsterdam scored four runs in the eleventh inning to earn its first win at Duffy Fairgrounds since 2005. Dave Giuliani (Stanford) scored in the eleventh inning on a sacrifice fly by Stosh Hoover (Trinity, Texas) to break an 8-8 tie. Mark Onorati (Manhattan) followed later with a RBI single and Mike Spina (Cincinnati) capped off the rally with a two-run double. Ricky Breymier (Pittsburgh) struck out five and held Watertown without a hit over three and two-thirds innings of relief to earn the win. The Wizards scored six runs in the first inning only to watch the Mohawks scratch off eight-straight runs from the second inning through the top of the seventh to take an 8-6 lead. Greg Herbst (Kansas) knotted the game at eight with a two-run base hit in seventh. For Amsterdam, Onorati and Spina each had three hits; Onorati tallied three runs. Greg Herbst finished 2-for-4 with three RBI for the Wizards.

ROCHESTER, N.Y. – Geoff Dornes (R.I.T.) allowed two runs over seven innings and the Yankees reeled off six runs in the fourth inning to streak past the Red Wings at St. John Fisher College. Dornes scattered nine hits, walked two, struck out four and stranded nine Red Wings on base. Webster's six-run fourth was a result of three hits and three Geneva errors. The rally was buoyed by a John Kenny (Hofstra) two-run single and a Cory Brownsten (Pittsburgh) two-run triple. T.J. Baumet (Ball State) paced the Pinstripes with two hits and two runs scored. For Geneva, Matt Perry (Holy Cross) was 2-for-4 with a run scored and Eddie Mendiola (Notre Dame) had two hits and one RBI.

HORNELL, N.Y. – Adam Gray (Mercyhurst) went 3-for-5 with three RBI and two runs scored as the Dodgers downed the Athletics at Maple City Park.
