##### Allegany County 1 Bolivar 0

SCIO, N.Y. – Joe Scarlata (Columbia) pitched a complete game four-hit shutout as the Nitros blanked the Athletics at Scio Central School. Scarlata spread out four hits, walked one and struck out six in his third complete game of the summer. Scott McNee (W.P.I.) scored Allegany County's only run in the second inning on a Damon Arnold (Alderson-Broadus) ground out. McNee singled to start the inning, moved to second on a walk and stole third to set up Arnold's RBI ground out. Three Bolivar pitchers combined on a three-hitter in defeat. Stephen Jenkins (Mercer) yielded one run on two hits and struck out four over six innings. John Slick (Bethel, Minn.) and Paul Smith (Hillsdale) held the Nitros to one hit in the final two innings.

##### Little Falls 11 Amsterdam 5

AMSTERDAM, N.Y. – Jared Freni (Massachusetts) pitched seven shutout innings and the Miners pounded out 11 runs on 13 hits to defeat the Mohawks at Shuttleworth Park. Freni whirled a four-hit shutout through seven innings, walked three and struck out nine. Mike Augustine (Boston College) crushed a three-run home run in the third and later doubled and scored in the seventh as the Miners built a 10-0 lead. Little Falls plated at least one run in five of nine at-bats and twice erupted for four runs in one inning. Nick Campbell (Bryant) had a two-run triple for the Miners. Amsterdam's Ben Clowe (Stanford) belted a two-run home run in the eighth, his third of the season, to break up the shutout.

##### Hornell 20 Niagara 5

HORNELL, N.Y. – The Dodgers scored 20 of the game's final 21 runs to rout the Power at Maple City Park. Hornell rallied from deficits of 4-0 and 5-4 to force a five-all tie after four. The Blue and White broke the game open with a six-run fifth and later scored nine runs in the seventh. All nine Hornell starters had at least one hit and nine players scored at least one run. Zach Kinkeade (St. Charles CC) went 3-for-4 with three RBI, Drew Pixley (Mineral Area) was 2-for-4 with three RBI and three runs scored and Jose Sanchez (Delaware State) had three hits, two RBI and two runs scored. For Niagara, Joe Durham (Samford) was 3-for-5 with one RBI and Zach Leighton (Vanguard) drove in two.

##### Glens Falls 2 Watertown 1

WATERTOWN, N.Y. – Jack Wagoner (Sacred Heart) hurled a three-hitter over seven innings and Nick McCoy (San Diego) walked twice and scored two runs as the Golden Eagles edged the Wizards in front a Watertown franchise-record crowd of 3,796. Wagoner allowed a run in the first inning and then held the Wizards to just two hits over the next six frames. Nick McCoy scored on a Chad Stang (Midland) RBI single to tie the game at one in the fifth and then crossed the plate on a wild pitch in the seventh with the eventual game-winning run. Luis Feliz (Rutgers) had a game-high two hits for Glens Falls. Jake Gorman (Holy Cross) clouted a solo home run to pace the Wizards. Watertown starter Jacob Wiley (Marist) held Glens Falls to four hits over six innings in a no decision.

ELMIRA, N.Y. – Rye Davis (Western Kentucky) pitched a four-hit shutout over six innings and Drew Ash (Ithaca) was 2-for-4 with two runs scored and one RBI as the Pioneers defeated the Yankees at Dunn Field. Davis yielded four hits, walked two and struck out five to blank the Yankees offense. Ash helped Elmira out to a 4-0 lead as he drove in a run with a RBI fielders' choice in the third and then scored a run in the fifth on a Drew Morgan (Western Kentucky) single. After Webster rallied for two runs in the top of the seventh, Ash singled and scored in the bottom half of the frame to increase Elmira's lead. Chris Spatkowski (Pace), J.J. Edwards (Sacred Heart) and Drew Morgan all had two hits for the Pioneers; Morgan drove in two runs. Cory Brownsten (Pittsburgh) ripped a two-run single for Webster and John Kenny (Hofstra) was 2-for-4 with one RBI.

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. – The Phillies pounded out nine runs on 13 hits and Josh Simmons (Wheaton, Mass.) quelled a ninth-inning rally as Saratoga defeated Bennington at East Side Rec. Saratoga erased a 3-2 deficit with four runs in the fourth and then extended its lead with a three-run seventh. Bennington plated two runs in the ninth and had the go-ahead run at the plate when Simmons induced a game-ending fly out.
