GLENS FALLS, N.Y. – Shane Davis (Canisius) pitched a complete game two-hit shutout and the Golden Eagles scored four runs in the sixth inning to defeat the Mohawks at East Field. Davis walked one, struck out three and carried a no-hitter into the eighth inning. The Golden Eagles used three walks, two hits and a wild pitch to score four runs in the sixth inning. Jonathan White (Vanderbilt) provided the big blow of the rally with a two-run single. White collected two of Glens Falls' four hits in the game and Stefen Romero (Pima CC) had one RBI. Jim Banks (Albany) and Logan Darnell (Kentucky) collected one hit apiece for Amsterdam; Banks broke up Davis' no-hitter with a lead-off single in the eighth inning.

Geneva 3 Brockport 2

GENEVA, N.Y. – Dan Rouah (Lynn), Aaron Brett (Central Missouri) and Jason Koziol (Geog Mason) combined on a five-hitter and the Wings used a two-run fifth inning to end the Riverbats eight-game winning streak. Rouah allowed two runs on five hits through seven innings and then Brett and Koziol each hurled a scoreless frame of relief to hold a one-run lead. All-star Doug Elliot (UCONN) broke a 1-1 tie in the fifth with a RBI double. Later in the inning, Kevin McGrath (West Chester) doubled home all-star Eddie Mendiola (Notre Dame) with the eventual game-winning run. Brockport plated a single run in the sixth but stranded the potential tying run on base. The Wings pounded out 16 hits led by three from Doug Elliot and four from Ryan Uphouse (Geog Mason). Corey Taylor (Binghamton) and Joe Pavone (UCONN) drove in one run apiece for Brockport.

BOLIVAR, N.Y. – Pinch runner Drew Pixley (Mineral Area) scored on an Andrew Jesse (St. Joseph's, Ind.) sacrifice fly in the ninth inning to lead the Dodgers past the Athletics in a wild Wednesday-night game at Bolivar-Richburg High School. Pixley's eventual game-winning tally came seconds before an inning-ending force out at first base following Jesse's fly out. The game featured two ties, two lead changes, 15 runs and nine pitchers. Bolivar erased a 4-2 Hornell advantage with a five-run sixth inning. The Dodgers rallied to tie the game with three runs in the seventh inning. Hornell's Abe Steinbach (Emporia State) collected a game-high four hits and Adam Eggemeyer (SIU Edwardsville) was 3-for-4 with three RBI. Gabe Grinder (Indiana, Pa.), Cody Fuqua (Williams Baptist) and Kevin Cope (UAB) all had three hits for Bolivar.

ELMIRA, N.Y. – Harrison Helms (Niagara) allowed three hits over seven innings and the Power outscored the Pioneers, 5-1, over the final six frames to end a six-game losing streak. Helms yielded three unearned runs on three hits, walked five and struck out four. ROCHESTER, N.Y. – The playoff picture in the Western Division remained murky as the Nitros and Yankees split a twin bill.

Game 1 – The Yankees scored six runs over the first two innings to race past the Nitros in the opening game. Western Division Player of the Week John Kenny (Hofstra), all-star Geoff Dornes (R.I.T.) and Cory Brownsten (Pittsburgh) all scored one run each in the first and second innings as the Yankees jumped out to a 6-1 lead. Kenny, Dornes and Brownsten combined to score all of Webster's eight runs; Kenny recorded four tallies. Kyle Weldon (Miami, Ohio) drove in a game-high three runs for the Pinstripes. Alex Raetzloff (Webster) was 2-for-3 with two RBI to lead the Nitros.

Game 2 – Allegany County exploded for seven-straight runs en route to a victory in the night cap. The Nitros rallied from a 1-0 deficit after one with four runs in the second and three runs in the fourth. A Webster tally in the bottom of the fourth was answered by a pair of scores in the top of the fifth. Alex Raetzloff (Webster) went 2-for-4 with three RBI and Ryan Holley (Binghamton) drove in two runs while Damon Arnold (Alderson-Broadbudds) and Kyle Davis (Delaware) each scored two runs. Nick Vallillo (Monmouth) hurled five and a third innings of relief to earn the victory. All-star T.J. Baumet (Ball State) had two hits and one RBI in the loss for the Yankees.

Little Falls 8 Watertown 1

WATERTOWN, N.Y. – Morgan Smith (Binghamton) whirled a four-hitter through seven innings and the Miners banged out eight runs on 15 hits to blast the Wizards at Duffy Fairgrounds. Smith allowed a single run in the second on a solo home run, walked none and struck out a season-high eight. Little Falls plated two runs each in the first, third, fourth and eighth innings. Joaquin Valdes (Palm Beach Atlantic) led the Miners 15-hit outburst with three hits and a game-high four RBI; David Wendt (Dowling) went 3-for-5 with one RBI and one run scored. Nine Miners recorded at least one hit and Eastern Division Player of the Week Nick Campbell (Bryant) scored three runs. Greg Herbst (Kansas) belted a home run for the Wizards.

The Eastern Division has never won a New York Collegiate Baseball League All-Star Game played at Alex T. Duffy Fairgrounds in Watertown, N.Y. Monday's contest was the third All-Star Game played at Duffy Fairgrounds. The West defeated the East, 9-5. In 2004, the West blanked the East, 1-0, behind a combined no-hitter. Two years later, the West won another one-run decision, 5-4. In that contest, the tying run was thrown out at home plate by Rochester's Ryan Jablonski to end the game. Victories by the Eastern Division have come in 2007 at Amsterdam's Shuttleworth Park and at Wayne County's Colburn Park (Newark, N.Y.) in 2005.
