#### Amsterdam 2 Saratoga 0

AMSTERDAM, N.Y. – Logan Darnell (Kentucky) and Ricky Breymier (Pittsburgh) combined on a six-hit shutout and Chris Bisson (Kentucky) was 2-for-3 with two runs scored as the Mohawks edged the Phillies in a pitchers' duel. Darnell spaced out four hits, walked one and struck out four through seven innings. Ricky Breymier fanned six over the final two frames for a save. Bisson walked and eventually scored on a wild pitch in the first He singled and scored on a Mike Spina (Cincinnati) RBI single in the sixth. Saratoga starter Kellen St. Luce (Vanderbilt) allowed two runs on three hits through five and two-thirds innings and fanned a season-high eight. He set down 13-straight batters from the first inning through the fifth. David Batchelder (Saint Peter's) and Josh Simmons (Wheaton, Mass.) held the Mohawks scoreless from the Saratoga bullpen.

#### Glens Falls 12 Little Falls 10

LITTLE FALLS, N.Y. – The Golden Eagles raced out to an early 8-2 lead and held off a late charge from the Miners to earn a victory at Veterans Memorial Park. Glens Falls plated eight runs over the first three innings and built an 11-4 lead through six. The Miners rallied with four runs in the seventh and then answered a single Glens Falls' run in the eighth with two in the ninth. Glens Falls closer Marc Damon (Pima CC) stranded the potential tying-run on second to end the game. The contest featured 22 runs, 16 hits, four home runs, five errors and seven pitchers. For Glens Falls, Stefen Romero (Pima CC) was 4-for-5 with a home run and three RBI, Anthony Giansanti (Siena) went 3-for-5 with a dinger and three runs batted in and Kody Johnson (Pima CC) had a home run and three RBI. John Spatola (Boston College) smashed a two-run home run for the Miners while Taylor Traub (Oakland) and Jeff Lieneck (Wheaton, Mass.) drove in three runs each.

#### Hornell 7 Allegany County 2

HORNELL, N.Y. – Sean Toler (Missouri State) and J.C. Casey (Missouri State) combined on a three-hitter and the Dodgers scored seven runs over the final six innings to defeat the Nitros at Maple City Park. Toler allowed one run on one hit over six innings, struck out four, walked seven and carried a no-hitter into the sixth. Casey let in one run on two hits and struck out four in the final three frames. The Blue and White plated one run in the fourth, two in the sixth, one in the seventh and three in the eighth on five hits and four Nitros errors. Adam Gray (Mercyhurst) scored two of the Dodgers first three tallies and Abe Steinbach (Emporia State) was 1-for-4 with a RBI. Damon Arnold (Alderson-Broadbudd) and Alex Raetzloff (Webster) each drove in a run for Allegany County.

GENEVA, N.Y. – The Yankees and the Red Wings split a non-traditional doubleheader at McDonough Park on Thursday night.

**Game 1** – Webster held off a late rally from Geneva to earn a victory in the opening game. The contest was resumed from where it was halted on June 18 with Webster leading, 4-0. Mark Wiggins (UMass Lowell) scored on a wild pitch in the eighth to push the Yankees lead to five. Geneva surged for four runs in the bottom of the inning but could not touch Webster closer Sam Dawes (Miami, Ohio) for the tying run. Webster starter Dustin Ramey (UMass Lowell) pitched seven and two-thirds innings, allowed four runs on seven hits and struck out 11. Geoff Dornes (R.I.T.) was 2-for-4 with two runs scored and John Kenny tallied three hits and two RBI. John Sills (Holy Cross) paced the Red Wings with three hits in three trips, two runs batted in and one run scored.

**Game 2** – Mike Assmann (Cortland State) and Kris Mingle (George Mason) combined on a five-hit shutout and Nick Spears (Texas Pan-American) bashed a three-run home run to give Geneva a win in the night cap. Assmann allowed four hits, walked six and struck out seven in six innings pitched. Mingle held Webster to one hit over the final three frames. Spears' three-run home run broke a scoreless tie in the second inning. The Wings clumped together five more runs over the middle innings to take control. Will Harford (Notre Dame) was 2-for-3 with three RBI and two runs scored, Ryan Uphouse (George Mason) had two hits and scored three runs and Matt Perry (Holy Cross) was 2-for-4.

BENNINGTON, Vt. – The Wizards and the Bombers traded shutouts in a Thursday afternoon doubleheader at Southern Vermont College.

**Game 1** – Ken Kerski (Central Conn. St) and Brett Fratzke (Minnesota State) combined on a three-hit shutout and the Wizards stung Bennington starter Matt Fyffe (Eastern Kentucky) for three runs in the seven-inning opener. Kerski allowed one hit and struck out three in two and two-thirds innings. Fratzke entered in the third and yielded just two hits over the final four and a third-innings. Watertown's Kyle Dimino (Cortland State) broke a scoreless tie in the fifth with a RBI single. Curtis Lazar (Maryland) and Jay Bresnahan (Minnesota State) added run-scoring singles in the sixth. Dimino and Bresnahan each had two hits and one RBI.

**Game 2** – Keith Rakus (Vermont) tossed a complete game six-hit shutout and the Bombers blasted three home runs to win the night cap. Rakus spread out six hits over seven innings, walked six and struck out four. Michael Sudol (Boston College) and Andy Drexel (Hartford) bombed back-to-back solo home runs in the second inning and Dylan Stone (Bryant) capped off a five-run fifth inning with a three-run belt. Drexel was 2-for-3 with three RBI and two runs scored, Stone went 2-for-4 with three RBI and Sean Burns (UMass Lowell) was 2-for-4 with one run batted in.

BOLIVAR, N.Y. – Craig Page (Lyon) pitched eight shutout innings and the Athletics used a four-run second to sprint past the Power. Page scattered eight hits, struck out two and retired 10 of the final 11 batters he faced. Bolivar's four second-inning runs scored on four hits. Michael Fear (Morehead State) and Gabe Grinder (Indiana, Pa.) each socked run-scoring singles and Cody Fuqua (Williams Baptist) lashed a two-run base hit. Fuqua finished 2-for-4 with two RBI and Hayden Moss (Arizona State) was 2-for-2 with two runs scored.
