##### Amsterdam 5 Glens Falls 4

AMSTERDAM, N.Y. - Mark Onorati (Manhattan) went 2-for-2 with two RBI and two runs scored as the Mohawks clipped the first-place Golden Eagles at Shuttleworth Park. Onorati scored on a Ben Clowe (Stanford) RBI single in the seventh inning to break a 3-3 tie and he drove in the eventual game-winning run with a RBI single in the eighth. Glens Falls battled back early in the game from down 2-0 and 3-1 but a ninth-inning rally fell one run short against Mohawks reliever Sean Gregory (Albany). Amsterdam's Josh Hammonds (Radford) pitched two and two-thirds innings of scoreless relief to earn the win. Mike Spina (Cincinnati) clouted his fourth home run of the season. For Glens Falls, Jonathan White (Vanderbilt) was 1-for-4 with one run scored and one RBI. White scored on a Jose Valerio (San Diego) RBI single to tie the game at three in the sixth and he drove in one run in the ninth inning.

##### Little Falls 2 Saratoga 1

LITTLE FALLS, N.Y. - Eastern Division Player of the Week Nick Campbell (Bryant) belted a walk-off single in the ninth to lead the Miners over the Phillies. Campbell ripped a two-out single to score Andrew Stafford (Oakland) with the game-winning run. Saratoga had tied the game in the top of the ninth on a two-out RBI single by David Coleman (Virginia). The majority of the game was a pitchers' duel between Little Falls' Jared Freni (Massachusetts) and Saratoga's Mike Fiers (Nova Southeastern). Freni pitched seven scoreless innings, allowed five hits and struck out nine. Fiers fanned eight batters in eight innings and gave up one run on seven hits. David Wendt (Dowling) drove in the Miners first run in the sixth inning with a RBI single.

##### Allegany County 7 Elmira 6

SCIO, N.Y. - The Nitros scored two seventh-inning runs to slip past the Pioneers in a high-scoring affair at Scio Central School. Damon Arnold (Alderson-Broadus) forced a six-all tie with a seventh-inning RBI ground out. Ryan Holley (Binghamton) recorded the eventual game-winning score on a successful double steal with Matthew Kempin (Des Moines Area CC). Ten of the contest's 13 runs were tallied in the middle innings as Elmira rallied from a 1-0 deficit with four runs in the fifth and two in the sixth while Allegany County recorded three runs in the fifth and one in the sixth. For the Nitros, Rob Herrmann (Fredonia State) and Alex Raetzloff (Webster) each had two hits and one RBI. Rob Fondu (Furman) walked thrice and scored two runs. Starter Joe Scarlata (Columbia) scattered 12 hits over eight and a third innings pitched to earn the win. Ryan Riley (Mansfield), Nick Messinger (Siena) and Mike Perkins (UNC-Charlotte) each went 2-for-4 with one RBI for the Pios.

##### Geneva 20 Bolivar 4

GENEVA, N.Y. - The Red Wings scored a season-high 20 runs on 22 hits to defeat the Athletics at McDonough Park. Geneva is the fourth Western Division team to reach the 20-run plateau this season. The Wings join Niagara, Webster and Hornell in the 20-run club. Will Harford (Notre Dame) went 4-for-6 with three RBI to lead Geneva's 22-hit outburst. Kevin McGrath (West Chester) slammed two home runs for the Red Wings and Matt Perry (Holy Cross) added his first home run of the season.

BROCKPORT, N.Y. – Ryan O'Rourke (Merrimack) and David Gagnon (Clark) combined on a five-hit shutout and the Riverbats pounded out 12 runs on 12 hits to hammer the Yankees at SUNY Brockport. O'Rourke tossed seven shutout innings and gave up four hits. Gagnon pitched the final two frames, yielded one hit and fanned three. Brockport plated five runs in the second and scored at least one run in five of eight innings. Eight of the 'Bats nine starters had one hit or more. Eric Guillen (USC Upstate) was 2-for-2 with three RBI, Ryan Nokelby (Texas Lutheran) went 2-for-2 with three RBI and two runs scored and Jesse Bosnik (St. Bonaventure) was 2-for-2 with two RBI. Joe Pavone (UCONN) and Jeremy Macklin (Huston-Tillotson) each scored three runs.

WATERTOWN, N.Y. – For the second day in a row, the Bombers and Wizards split a pair of seven-inning contests.

**Game 1** – Mitchell Eilenberg (Massachusetts) pitched a complete-game four-hitter and the Bombers erupted for three runs in the fourth inning to win the opening game. Eilenberg allowed one run on four hits, walked one, struck out five and retired 17 of the last 19 batters he faced. Rudy Jovanovski (Ouachita Baptist) erased a 1-0 Bennington deficit with a two-run double in the fourth. Andy Drexel (Hartford) capped off the three-run rally with a RBI single. Jovanovski and Drexel each finished with two hits and Michael Sudol (Boston College) clouted a solo home run. Greg Herbst (Kansas) plated the Wizards lone run with a first-inning RBI double.

**Game 2** – Cory Nelson (LeMoyne) allowed one hit over six innings and the Wizards scored five unanswered runs to win the night cap. Nelson held Bennington to one run on one hit, walked four and struck out seven. Tristan Hobbes (ECSU) roped a second-inning RBI single to put the Bombers ahead, 1-0. Watertown tied the game with a single run in the fourth and then plated two runs each in the fifth and sixth innings. Greg Herbst (Kansas) provided a RBI double and Khyle Dimino (Cortland State) hit a two-run single. Tom Barry (Phoenix) paced the Wizards with two hits.
