BENNINGTON, Vt. - The Mohawks plated four runs in the first inning but needed two runs over the final two frames to hold off the Bombers at Southern Vermont College. Amsterdam raced out to a 4-0 lead after one inning but watched Bennington pull to within 5-4 in the seventh. Dave Giuliani (Stanford) drove in the eventual game-winning run with a RBI single in the eighth and Mike Spina (Cincinnati) answered a Bennington eighth-inning tally with a solo home run in the ninth. For Amsterdam, Cody Reine (LSU) socked a two-run triple and Ricky Pacione (Marist) scored two runs. Joey Bergman (Charleston) and Tristan Hobbes (ECSU) each went 2-for-4 with one RBI and one run scored for the Bombers.

Hornell 8 Webster 4

ARKPORT, N.Y. - Hornell scored eight runs over the final four innings to rally past Webster in a game played at Arkport Central School. The Dodgers notched three runs in the sixth inning to erase a 3-0 deficit and then reeled off four in the seventh to take the lead. Dodger second baseman Greg Laughlin (SW Minnesota State) singled and scored in the sixth and then broke a 3-3 tie in the seventh with a RBI single. He finished 3-for-5 with two runs scored. Trey Bennett (Mercyhurst) keyed the seventh-inning rally with a two-out, two-run single. The Blue and White recorded 13 of their 16 hits over the final four frames and six Dodgers posted multi-hit games. Mark Wiggins (UMass Lowell) led the Yankees 10-hit attack with two singles and two runs scored. Kyle Weldon (Miami, Ohio) added a solo home run.

BROCKPORT, N.Y. - The Riverbats rallied for four runs in the eighth inning to surprise the Pioneers at SUNY Brockport. Brockport's four eighth-inning tallies scored on one hit, five walks, one error, one sacrifice fly and a passed ball. The Riverbats tied the game and took the lead on back-to-back bases-loaded walks to Kyle Harvey (Texas Lutheran) and Billy Herman (Slippery Rock). Elmira had taken a 3-0 lead with three runs in the middle innings on a Nick Messinger (Siena) RBI single, wild pitch and a Drew Morgan (WKU) RBI double. For Brockport, Jesse Bosnik (St. Bonaventure) was 1-for-4 with one RBI and one run scored. Elmira's Morgan and Messinger each had two hits and one run batted in.

GLENS FALLS, N.Y. - Billy Barrett (Illinois), Will Hassett (Siena) and Marc Damon (Pima CC) combined on a five-hit shutout as the Golden Eagles defeated the Miners at East Field. Barrett gave up two hits through five innings, Hassett allowed three hits in three innings and Damon hurled a scoreless ninth. Little Falls starter Nate Bayuk (Boston College) struck out 10 in six innings but allowed one unearned run on four hits. Stefen Romero (Pima CC) plated Chad Stang (Midland) with a RBI ground out in the third inning to break a scoreless tie. WATERTOWN, N.Y. – Luis Castillo (Jefferson CC) pitched a three-hitter over seven innings and the Wizards scored a season-high 13 runs on 19 hits to blow out the Phillies at Duffy Fairgrounds. Castillo spread out three hits, walked none and struck out three in his longest outing of the season. Watertown exploded for six runs in the second inning and later tallied five in the sixth and two in the eighth. Jay Bresnahan (Minnesota State) highlighted the six-run second with a three-run double. Derek Marshall (Saint Rose) swatted a three-run home run in the sixth and Jake Gorman (Holy Cross) belted a two-run bomb in the eighth. Marshall finished with three hits, Gorman was 3-for-5 with two RBI and two runs scored and Brad Felder (Citadel) went 3-for-5 with two runs batted in.

DID YOU KNOW

The Northeastern Collegiate Baseball League consisted of eight teams when the Hornell Dodgers and Geneva Knights became members in 1994. The other six league teams were the Cohocton Red Wings, Cortland Apples, Ithaca Lakers, Little Falls Diamonds, Rome Indians and Schenectady Mohawks. The Ithaca Lakers won the league championship in 1994, their first of three titles between 1992 and 1999 under head coach Joe Brown.
