GLENS FALLS, N.Y. – Jamie Storey (Midland) pitched seven strong innings and the Golden Eagles rallied for two runs in the sixth inning to edge the Bombers in a rain-shortened game at East Field. Storey allowed one unearned run on four hits, walked four and struck out a season-high eight. The Golden Eagles' two sixth-inning runs wiped away a 1-0 Bennington lead. Curt Courtwright (Missouri State) scored on a fielding error to tie the game at one. Jonathan White (Vanderbilt) plated Chad Stang (Midland) on a sacrifice fly to left field that put the Golden Eagles ahead, 2-1. Bennington starting pitcher Ben Sonberg (Keene State) gave up two runs (one earned) on four hits in six innings pitched. Michael Gropper (North Florida) had two hits for the Bombers.
