GLENS FALLS, N.Y. – Eastern Division Pitcher of the Week Shane Davis (Canisius), Will Hassett (Siena) and Anthony Giansanti (Siena) combined on a one-hit shutout as the Golden Eagles downed the Phillies at East Field. Davis allowed one hit in six innings, walked two and struck out three. Hassett and Giansanti held Saratoga hitless over the final three frames. Offensively, Glens Falls erupted for five runs in the first inning en route to eight scores on 13 hits. Five Golden Eagles posted multi-hit games. Chad Stang (Midland), Jose Valerio (San Diego) and Jonathan White (Vanderbilt) each had two hits and one run batted in. Kody Johnson (Pima CC) went 2-for-4 with two runs scored and Luis Feliz (Rutgers) added a RBI triple. Kyle Meyer (Marist) connected on a two-out single in the fifth for Saratoga.

Elmira 3 Hornell 0

ELMIRA, N.Y. – Jay Embree (Eastern Kentucky) and Chris Zelko (Mansfield) combined on a four-hit shutout to lead the Pioneers past the first-place Dodgers at Dunn Field. Embree allowed four hits, walked none and struck out five through six innings. Zelko held Hornell scoreless over the final two innings. Elmira's Chris Spatkowski (Pace) scored on a passed ball to break a scoreless tie in the fourth inning. The Pioneers plated two more runs in the eighth on a Ryan Price (Saint Rose) RBI single and a Chris Spatkowski RBI sacrifice. Spatkowski finished 2-for-3. Hornell starter Matt Stewart (St. Bonaventure) allowed three runs on six hits, walked two and struck out seven in seven and a third innings pitched.

Niagara 12 Allegany County 4

NIAGARA FALLS, N.Y. – Justin Tucker (Sinclair CC) went 2-for-4 with four RBI and Josh Sandlin (Cedarville) pitched seven strong innings to help the Power surge past the Nitros at Sal Maglie Stadium. Tucker erased a 3-2 deficit and sparked a four-run third inning with a two-run single. Tucker padded Niagara's lead with a two-run double in the fourth. Sandlin allowed three Allegany County runs on six hits, walked three and struck out four. After giving up three runs in the third, Sandlin held Allegany County to just two hits over the next four innings and the Niagara offense reeled off 10-straight runs. Joel Blomberg (Embry-Riddle) went 2-for-3 with three runs scored, Tyson Leighton (Vanguard) had two hits and Nate Radtke (Cleveland State) scored two runs. Alex Raetzloff (Webster) had a game-high four hits for Allegany County and Thomas Tolliver (Transylvania) recorded two runs scored.

The Niagara Power joined the New York Collegiate Baseball League for the 2007 season. The Power won its NYCBL debut on June 7, 2007 against the Bolivar A's at Bolivar-Richburg High School. In a memorable first game, Niagara edged Bolivar, 7-6, in 14 innings. Niagara scored two runs in the top of the 14th and held Bolivar to just one in the bottom half of the inning. The game ended when the potential tying run was picked off third base.
