Hornell 3 Elmira 0 (11)

ELMIRA, N.Y. – The Dodgers erupted for three runs in the 11th inning to defeat the Pioneers in front of a season-high 1,369 fans at Elmira's Dunn Field. Zach Kinkeade (St. Charles CC) broke a scoreless tie in the 11th with a two-out, two-run double. An Elmira throwing error allowed Kinkeade to score on the play. Four Hornell pitchers combined on a five-hit shutout. Starter Adam Schrader (SW Minnesota State) allowed three hits and struck out six over five innings. J.C. Casey (Missouri State) hurled three hitless frames, Ryan Maxa (Gardner-Webb) allowed two hits but held the Pios without a run for two innings and Josh Goodin (William Woods) tossed a scoreless 11th. The teams accounted for just eight hits in regulation. Elmira starter Rye Davis (WKU) yielded three this over seven innings and struck out eight in a no decision.

Geneva 5 Brockport 4

BROCKPORT, N.Y. – Matt Perry (Holy Cross) went 4-for-5 with three runs batted in to lead the Red Wings over the Riverbats at SUNY Brockport. Perry ripped a RBI double in the fifth and a go-ahead RBI single in the seventh before driving in the eventual game-winning score in the ninth with a RBI single. Perry's run-scoring single in the seventh inning was part of a two-run rally to erase a 4-3 Brockport lead. The 'Bats plated one run in the ninth but could not tie the game against Red Wings reliever Jason Koziol (George Mason). Nick Spears (Texas Pan-American) added two hits for Geneva and Kevin McGrath (West Chester) scored two runs. Brockport's Corey Taylor (Binghamton) went 2-for-3 with a home run and two RBI. Jesse Bosnik (St. Bonaventure) slugged a homer and scored two runs for the 'Bats.

Niagara 7 Bolivar 1

NIAGARA FALLS, N.Y. – Four pitchers combined on a five-hitter and the Power scored seven runs over the first five innings to shock the Athletics at Sal Maglie Stadium. Chris Kuenzle (Hannibal-LaGrange) tossed a two-hit shutout over five innings and the trio of Chris Hackett (Albany), Drew Hollinghead (Mississippi State) and Josh Aldridge (Pitt CC) held Bolivar to three hits over the final four frames. Niagara tallied at least one run in each of the first five innings and plated two in the third and fifth. Caleb Dalman (Wayne State) and Spencer Sobol (Belmont Abbey) each had two hits and two runs batted in and Tyson Leighton (Vanguard) recorded two runs scored. For Bolivar, Kevin Cope (UAB) went 2-for-3 with one run.

Little Falls 11 Amsterdam 7

AMSTERDAM, N.Y. – The Miners pounded out 11 runs on 14 hits to overpower the Mohawks at Shuttleworth Park. Little Falls scored at least one run in six of nine innings and out-tallied the Mohawks, 8-3, over the final six frames. Jeff Lieneck (Wheaton, Mass.) bashed a three-run home run in the first and then broke a 4-4 tie in the fifth inning with a RBI double off the left-field fence. Amsterdam rallied from down, 9-4, but could never get closer than three. For Little Falls, Lieneck went 2-for-5 with four RBI, John Spatola (Boston College) was 3-for-5 with one RBI and Andrew Stafford (Oakland) had four hits and one run scored. Spencer Korus (Kentucky) was 2-for-4 with three RBI and two runs scored to lead Amsterdam's 10-hit attack. Korus and Mike Spina (Cincinnati) slugged back-to-back home runs in the third inning to give the Mohawks a 4-3 lead.

Saratoga 4 Watertown 3

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. – Chris Buss (Old Dominion) ripped a two-out RBI double in the fifth and Jason Zinser (NC State) pitched four innings of scoreless relief to push the Phillies past the Wizards. Buss' run-scoring double broke a 3-3 deadlock. Zinser entered in the sixth and allowed three hits, walked one and struck out seven. He fanned four of the final five batters in the game. Saratoga plated three runs in the second inning and Watertown responded with two in the third and one in the fourth to tie the game. For the Phils, Domonique Rodgers (NC State) was 2-for-3 with two doubles, David Coleman (Virginia) went 2-for-4 and Vince Farfaglia (Francis Marion) had a sacrifice fly. Derek Marshall (Saint Rose), Greg Herbst (Kansas) and Ryan Faidley (Eastern Kentucky) drove in one run each for the Wizards.

Glens Falls 7 Bennington 2

BENNINGTON, Vt. – The Golden Eagles erupted for five runs in the fifth inning to race past the Bombers for their division-leading 22nd victory. The Golden Eagles five fifth-inning runs scored on three hits and erased a 1-0 deficit. Chad Stang (Midland) spearheaded the rally with a go-ahead, two-run triple. Glens Falls starter Jack Wagoner (Sacred Heart) held Bennington to one run on seven hits through six innings and he struck out six. Jose Valerio (San Diego) clouted a two-run home run for Glens Falls and went 2-for-4 with two runs scored and Chad Stang finished 2-for-3 with two RBI. Bennington's Jeff Bercume (Merrimack) recorded a game-high three hits and drove in one run.

DID YOU KNOW

Just two players have finished the regular season hitting .400 or higher since 2004. Last summer, Webster's Joe McIntyre led the league with a .409 batting average. He clubbed a league-leading 65 hits in 159 at-bats. Current Pittsburgh Pirates prospect James Barksdale hit .400 and stole a league-record 53 bases for the Allegany County Nitros in 2005. Barksdale was named the NYCBL Player of the Year.
